Starting January 1, 2023, for additions and alterations of existing one- and two-family dwellings and townhouses that are 750 square feet or larger, applicants will be required to meet an energy savings target score using a points-based system that offers flexibility and choice.



One- and Two-Family Residential

For existing single-family residences with renovations of 750 square feet or greater, flexibly choose to install a combination of energy efficiency and/or electrification measures.



Choose from a Menu: The Flexible Measures Pathway

0= 0=, Choose energy efficiency (e.g. insulation, PV), electric readiness, and/or electrification (e.g. heat pump, induction stove) measures from a menu developed and proven by the State to be cost-effective. Simply choose from the menu of measures and sum up points that add up to an established energy target score. Each point is equivalent to one million Btu's of energy savings per year.
