

NOTICE OF ELECTION AND ARGUMENT DEADLINES FOR SCHOOL AND DISTRICT MEASURES TO BE VOTED ON IN MARIN COUNTY AT THE JUNE 5, 2012 PRESIDENTIAL PRIMARY ELECTION

NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN by the Marin County Registrar of Voters that the **Presidential Primary Election will be held on Tuesday, June 5, 2012;** that the polls will be open from 7:00 a.m. until 8:00 p.m. on the day thereof; and

NOTICE IS FURTHER GIVEN that the following School and District measures will be placed upon the ballot at said election and read as follows:

MEASURES SUBMITTED TO VOTERS

ROSS VALLEY SCHOOL DISTRICT MEASURE A

To provide local funding the State cannot take away, preserve high quality education in reading, writing, math and science, educationally sound class sizes, school libraries, and art and music instruction, and to help attract and retain highly-qualified teachers, shall the Ross Valley School District renew its existing parcel tax for another eight years, increasing it by \$149 per year, with no funds used for administrators' salaries and an exemption for seniors, and requiring annual audits?

MUIR BEACH COMMUNITY SERVICES DISTRICT MEASURE E

Shall Muir Beach CSD Ordinance No. 2012-1, which imposes an annual special tax of two-hundred (\$200.00) dollars for a period of four (4) years, FY 2012-2013, FY 2013-2014 and FY 2014-2015, and 2015-2016, on each parcel within the Muir Beach CSD for fire protection, including fuel abatement and emergency preparedness, be approved and shall the Muir Beach CSD appropriations limit be increased by the amount of this voter-approved tax?

NOTICE IS FURTHER GIVEN that arguments for or against the above measures shall not exceed 300 words in length. The Registrar of Voters of Marin County shall print an argument for and argument against said measures in the sample ballot mailed to each voter in the above districts.

Arguments for or against said measures, with signed verification form, should be submitted to the Registrar of Voters' Office, Room 121, Marin Civic Center, San Rafael, California, **not later than 4:30 p.m. on Monday, March 19, 2012.** The governing board, or any member or members of the board, or any bona fide association of citizens, or any individual voter who is eligible to vote on the measure, or any combination of such associations and voters may submit written arguments for or against a measure.

NOTICE IS FURTHER GIVEN that direct arguments for or against said measures may not be changed or withdrawn after 4:30 p.m. on March 19, 2012.

NOTICE IS FURTHER GIVEN that when the Registrar of Voters has selected the arguments for and against said measures, copies of the argument in favor of said measures shall be sent to the authors of the argument against and copies of the argument against shall be sent to the authors of the argument in favor.

The authors may prepare and submit rebuttal arguments not exceeding 250 words. The rebuttal arguments must be filed with the Registrar of Voters by **4:30 p.m. on Monday, March 26, 2012**

Rebuttal arguments shall be printed in the same manner as the direct arguments. Each rebuttal argument shall immediately follow the direct argument, which it seeks to rebut.

A verification form available from the Registrar of Voters' Office must accompany all arguments and rebuttal arguments. Forms are available at www.marinvotes.org. For further information, contact the Registrar of Voters' Office at (415) 499-6437.

All materials pertaining to the measures will be available for public examination in the office of the Registrar of Voters for ten (10) days from the date of filing.

NOTE: Arguments for or against measures on the ballot for the Cities of Belvedere and Sausalito and the Town of Ross should be filed with the respective city or town clerk. Check with the city or town clerk for the deadlines to receive arguments and rebuttals.
